This comic-book is part of a local arts project called **Walkley Carnegie Library: Seeing Beauty, Inspiring Minds**, run by Walkley Carnegie Library and Ruskin in Sheffield.

The project was inspired by the famous art critic, thinker, and writer, John Ruskin. Ruskin believed it was important for everyone to observe the world closely. He felt drawing was the best way for people to see the world clearly, appreciate its beauty and decide what was important to them. Ruskin's Guild of St George donated a Collection of drawings, paintings, illustrated books, minerals and architectural casts to Sheffield in 1875 to educate and inspire the city's metal-workers. It was originally displayed at St George's Museum, a stone's throw away from Walkley Carnegie Library, which is now home to Ruskin's creative spirit in Walkley. The Ruskin Collection is now cared for by Museums Sheffield and displayed at the Millennium Gallery.
