Artist, critic and philanthropist, John Ruskin celebrated the beauty of nature and the value of human artistry and craft while caring deeply about the injustices of modern society.

He saw the damage being done to people and their environment by unfettered industrial capitalism, and in 1871 he set up a Guild with the intention of making Britain a happier and fairer place to live, work and flourish. Today, his concerns are no less pressing.

The Guild is a charity, with members around the world, who share a desire to put Ruskin's ideas into practice for the good of all. We are custodians of an art collection and land holdings for the public benefit, and we work with partners, including Sheffield Museums, The Wyre Community Land Trust, The Big Draw and the John Ruskin Prize, to promote Ruskin's values through art, craft, design, education and sustainable land management.
